
Ting Ting Lien, chair of Certification

Accomplished

- 1. Execute new application process for National Certified Teacher of Music that has launched last year.
- 2. Chairing workshop for the 2011 NJMTA conference. Feature "Are you ready for the challenge?"
- 3. Presenting new application process at the NJMTA state conference in one workshop.
- 4. Continue promoting adding NCTM as the TITLE to all the existing NCTM teachers' name for getting more recognition from the society. When the NCTM teachers' name is appeared on any of the publication, NCTM title should always goes with the name at the end. Example: Ting Ting Lien, NCTM
- 5. Teachers who gone through the NCTM process and successfully being certified continue to received \$50 check back for reimbursement of application fee.
- 6. In the year of 2011, we have 3 teachers become NCTM who gone through the new process in application.
- 7. The NJMTA Certification website is under constructed and will be upgraded soon. The referral list of NCTM teachers in New Jersey is also updated and most current now. All the new NCTM teachers' names have been updated as well.
- 8. The presentation materials for future promotion presentation are completed.
- 9. Acknowledge new NCTM teacher in the conference and presenting NCTM pin to the new NCTM teacher in public, this year at the banquet.
- 10. Marcia Yurko continue to be the Co-Chairperson for the Certification department.

In Process

- 1. Helping teachers who are interested in becoming NCTM going through the application process, explaining the process and answering all the questions.
- 2. Collecting more ideas to get more recognition for all the NCTM teachers.
- 3. Preparing certification workshop for 2011 conference for promotion purpose. Several newly certified teachers will be sharing their application experiences.
- 4. Collecting ideas and information of promoting NCTM program from different states and MTNA headquarter. Contacting new NCTM commissioner of Eastern division of MTNA.
- 5. Planning developing flyers for promotion. These flyers are planning to be handed out with the concert programs in the future, for educating the parents and society purpose.
- 6. Introducing and reinforcing the new NCTM application process with interested teachers.
- 7. Hoping to recruit some NCTM teachers to become mentor for future NCTM applicants. Goal is to have "one on one" mentorship.
- 8. Continue to collect information for future presentation for other educational schools or centers in order to promote their faculty to become a NCTM by using the 3rd options- administrative verification process.

Arts Advocacy 2011

The 6th Annual Children Helping Children Performathon was held on February 26th and February 27th. There were 5 Recitals on February 26th in Bristol Chapel and 8 Recitals on February 27th in Williamson Hall. Both locations are on the Campus of Westminster Choir College of Rider University. There were over 250 performers and 40 teachers involved in the concerts.

The NJMTA Children Helping Children Performathon continues to be a non-competitive music experience for students of all ages and levels of advancement.

The coming year, as last, the Performathon will raise money for the Ronald McDonald House Charities.

The 2011 Performathon raised a total of \$16,793.02 for the 3 Ronald McDonald Houses in New Jersey:

\$2,044.00 for the Ronald McDonald House of Southern Jersey. \$14,749.02 for the Ronald McDonald Houses of New Brunswick & Long Branch.

In addition to the music performances, all of us were treated to a display of over 30 visual and written works. Students submitted works reflecting on "What Music Means to Me." Other works spoke to a particular composer, performance, or piece of music.

These works were selected to be part of a summer exhibit, "Caring Kids in the Community". This exhibit was organized and sponsored by the Princeton Historical Society. The location was the Updike Farmstead, 354 Quaker Road, Princeton, N.J.

The Performathon continues to grow. In a program of this size, there are many people to thank.:

FINANCIAL REPORT

July 1, 2010 - June 30, 2011

1. Fiscal Year (July 1, 2010 - June 30, 2011), the summary INCOME - EXPENSES = \$115,912 - 97,306.06 = \$18,605.94

2. General Operations

- Transferred \$20,000 to ING Savings, which draws a 1.10% interest in saving accounts, 2nd highest in industry (highest is Discover Bank, which is 1.25%) Thanks to Linda Fields in administering the setup of account (complex for non-profit organizations.)
- **Yearbook** Change of printer service has resulted in a saving of \$1,000 in printing cost.

2009-10 Yearbook printer did not bill us for mailing service & lost the remaining yearbooks.

3. State Conference - 2010

There was a net loss of about \$2,400 was the smallest in last 3 years. This is due to:

- Rutgers University provided the facility almost free of charge, primarily pay for custodian and tuning.
- The attendants were about the same as in 2009, maybe slightly higher than 2009
- Use of new printer service, Minutemen Press, who is very responsive.
- 4. Fall Events (Young Musician Competition, Conference, Yearbook, MTNA)
- Composer Commission Competition has not received Sponsorship \$ of \$600 from MTNA yet.
- Strings, Winds and Voice areas combined had a 36% drop in enrollment.
- Piano Advanced Master Class Competition There is a 60% drop in enrollment this year (from 38 to about 14 students.) The Young Musicians part is about the same.

5. Recital Audition and Piano Festival

• Drop in enrollment for Both PIANO Recital Audition and Festival. Strings area had an in enrollment (yay!)

Parents and teachers appreciated the abbreviated recitals and structured format! I highly recommend that we continue this format in the future.
- These groups will need two full days of recital time for 2012.

2011 Spring Piano Festival Report - Sakiko Ono, Chang Liu

- a. Thanks to everyone, especially to Grace Chang, the Festival went well.
- b. Total number of registrants is 717. (Last year 781)
- c. 191 students registered for Feb. 20th, 2 students didn't show
- d. 526 students registered for Feb. 27th, 12 students didn't show
- e. 110 Three year medals, 64 Five year trophies, 22 Seven year trophies, and 3 Ten year trophies were awarded.
- f. We hired three high school students on Feb. 20, and 5 students on Feb. 27. They were very helpful.
- g. Suggestions for next year
 - 1. We hope the online registration data would be directly transposed to Excel spreadsheet.
 - 2. Registration and Waiting rooms worked very smoothly this year.
 - 3. We need more improvement in Tally room to avoid confusion.
 - 4. We should write "For any request for correction, a \$5 charge per person will be applied" on the letter to the teachers.
 - 5. We will change the pick-up results rule as "The certificates and written evaluations should be picked up after 5:00 p.m. on the audition day. If a teacher cannot pick them up personally, he/she can send another person with the release form (which is available online) signed by the teacher to pick them up in his/her place.".
 - 6. The teacher duty deposit will be \$50 evenly as 2011.

NJMTA 2011 Annual Report of Student Events

Thanks to the Spring Event's chairpersons for their excellent works and the members' participations and helps, the 2011's Spring Student Events – Spring Piano Festival and Recital Auditions – were successfully completed.

The 2011 Piano Festival – There were 78 teachers participated and 781 students entered for this event. NJMTA awarded 112 medals, 65 fifth year trophies, 22 seventh year trophies, and 3 tenth year plaques to 2011's Festival event.

The 2011 Recital Auditions – There were 5 different dates and 4 centers with 10 days' recitals. There were 158 piano teachers, 13 Strings teachers, 5 Voices teachers, and 7 Winds teachers entered 1410 Piano students, 72 Strings students, 23 Voices students, and 34 Winds students. There were also 65 Chinese Instruments students enrolled for the Audition Recitals.
